Message from the Director

As the new school year begins, so too do fresh opportunities for all the residents of Jobe. This is a time for growth—opportunities to advance their education, expand their networks, build meaningful relationships, and grow as voung adults. Education is the cornerstone of the Jobe program, and we believe it is the key that unlocks doors to future success. At lobe, we emphasize to our residents that "success builds success," and we are committed to helping them lay the foundation for a prosperous future. Many of our former residents have already transitioned into successful careers in fields such as engineering, social welfare, healthcare, media, and more. We believe that with the right nurturing, guidance, support, and expectations, all youth have the potential to succeed. 
